

Analytical Writing

This section consists of two separately timed writing tasks, Analyze an Issue and Analyze an Argument, in that order. Standard timing for this section is as follows.

- Analyze an Issue task 30 minutes
- Analyze an Argument task 30 minutes

Each task has its own timer. The timer displays the time remaining for that task.

- text that is substantially similar to that found in one or more other test ess v responses
- quoting or paraphrasing, without attribution, language that appears in puttished or unpublished sources; including sources from the Internet and/or sources provided by anythird party;
- unacknowledged use of work that has been produced through collaboration with others without citation of the contribution of others;
- essays that are submitted as work of the examinee when the code have, in fact, been borrowed from elsewhere or prepared by another person.

When one or more of the preceding circumstances occurs, ETS may conclude, in its professional judgment, that the essay response does not reflect the independent writing skills that this less seks to measure. When ETS reaches that conclusion, it cancels the Analytical Writing score, and because Analytical Writing scores are an integral part of the GRE General Test scores, those scores are canceled as well.
